Galleri Tom Christoffersen exhibits Julie Nord's 14 artworks created as illustrations to Lone Hørslev's poetry collection *The Days are Data*. *The Days are Data* was published November 2nd 2018 by Rosinante and was warmly received by the Danish press:

Julie Nord (1970) has had solo exhibitions at several Danish art museums such as ARoS Aarhus Art Museum, Gl Strand, Copenhagen and Kunsten – Museum of Modern Art, Aalborg. Her works are part of the collections at Danish art museums such as The National Museum of Art, ARoS, Arken, among others and internationally at The Nordic Watercolour Museum, Sweden, Lyonel Feininger Museum, Germany and Biblioteque Nationale de France, France. From 1994-2001 Julie Nord was educated at the Royal Danish Academy of Art, Copenhagen. Until March 31st Julie Nord shows new works and a selection of old ones at the exhibition *Fantasmer* at Rønnebæksholm, Næstved.
